Bren MacDibble was raised on farms all over New Zealand before travelling the world and finally settling in Melbourne. After 20 years in Melbourne, Bren recently sold everything, and now lives and works in a bus travelling around Australia.

Bren's first novel was young adult science fiction novel, **In the Dark Spaces**, which she published under the pen name Cally Black. **In the Dark Spaces** won the Ampersand Prize for an unpublished manuscript, and, once published, went on to win the New Zealand Book Award for Young Adult Fiction, an Aurealis Award and the Queensland Literary Award Griffiths University Young Adult Book Award.

In 2018, **How to Bee** - Bren's first novel for younger readers - won the Children's Book Council Book of the Year Award for Younger Readers, the New South Wales Premier's Literary Award Patricia Wrightson Prize for Children's Literature, and the New Zealand Book Awards Wright Family Foundation Esther Glen Award for Junior Fiction

Bren's most recent novel is **The Dog Runner**.



She is a proud ambassador for the Premier's Reading Challenge, Room to Read and Books in Homes. Deb's won awards for her books but mostly hopes to be as brave as her characters.



On Our Radar




On Nat's radar this episode is this year's Australian Reading Hour.
